Catching Up

This is Healy Lake's first newsletter, so it would only seem fit to mention some news from the past months, as well as in June. To begin with, a team rebuilt the deck on the community hall, which now includes a ramp on the left front side and a porch for the tribe's grill on the back right. It was finished shortly before the passing of elder David Joe Sr., who's potlatches were held both at Dot Lake and at the Healy Lake community hall. Throughout 2017, people have also been working hard to refurbish and add to Healy Lake's community



facilities. As of the end of June, the community has had functioning plumbing in the washeteria, a new maintenance facility, there is an operational landfill site, and the council has purchased new equipment.

During the month of June, many things were either established or restored. The tribe's first official website was launched on June 21st, by Alissa Healy, one of the newly instated youth council members. As each of the youths has gotten older, the level of interest in a youth council has grown. Currently, the tribe is taking the steps needed to understand how to officially start a youth council. It's time to make it happen, so hopefully we can work together and have Healy Lake's youth council up and running as soon as possible!
